Friedrich Adler Salad Servers



Friedrich Adler, the son of a Jewish merchant, was born in 1878 in the Upper Swabian town of Laupheim.

He earned his living as a free-lance artist and later as a professor at the College of Art in Hamburg. In 1942 he was murdered in Auschwitz.

His artistic work varies between Art Nouveau and Bauhaus and comprises architectural designs, sculpture, stained-glass windows, furniture, jewellery and sacral art.



One of the early industrial designers, he drafted numerous household objects made of synthetics for the Brebit Works, such as these salad servers, dated 1934, that are presented here. They have been reproduced, on the occasion of Adler's 140<sup>th</sup> birthday, by the Society of History and Commemoration.

The Museum of the History of Christians and Jews in Laupheim acknowledges the wide range of Friedrich Adler's creative activity in a room especially devoted to the artist.
